NATIONAL



<u>Feeding America:</u> Partners with food banks, food pantries, and local food programs to bring food to people facing hunger.



<u>Covenant House:</u> Serves and advocates for youth and young families experiencing homelessness, human trafficking, and exploitation.

BOSTON



<u>Greater Boston Food Bank:</u> Works to end hunger across Eastern Massachusetts by providing individuals in need the healthy food and resources they need to thrive.



<u>Heading Home:</u> Provides emergency, transitional and permanent housing, and support services, to extremely low-income homeless and formerly homeless children and adults.



<u>House of Hope:</u> Dedicated to homeless families in Massachusetts, helping them gain stable housing.

CHICAGO



<u>Christmas Without Cancer:</u> Provides financial assistance, basic necessities, and Christmas gifts to local Chicago families that are stricken with cancer.



<u>Cradles to Crayons:</u> Provides Chicagoland children from birth through age 12, living in homeless or low-income situations, with essential items.



<u>Family Rescue:</u> Dedicated to eliminating domestic violence by offering comprehensive support services and shelter to survivors, particularly women and children.

COLUMBUS



<u>Dot's Tots:</u> Provides support to families offering foster care and/or adoption, children with debilitating disease, injury, and/or illness; and teenagers in their higher educational pursuits.



<u>Huckleberry House:</u> Provides shelter, support, and guidance to young people facing difficult situations through four main programs: a 24/7 Crisis Shelter, a Transitional Living Program, a Counseling Center, and a Youth Outreach Program.



Mid-Ohio Food Collective: Addresses the root causes of hunger while working with more than 600 partner agencies in 20 counties to feed hundreds of thousands of hungry Ohioans every year.

DALLAS



<u>Community Partners of Dallas:</u> Provides the urgent tangible resources and support abused and neglected children need today to find hope, healing and thrive tomorrow.



<u>Hope Supply Co.:</u> Meets the critical needs of homeless and at-risk children in North Texas by providing essentials, including diapers, wipes, hygiene items, baby food and formula, clothing, school supplies, and toys.



North Texas Food Bank: Finds unique solutions to the ongoing pursuit of closing the hunger gap in North Texas. Distributes donated and purchased foods through a network of nearly 500 partner agencies and organizations in 12 counties.

NEW YORK



<u>The Child Center of NY:</u> Supports nearly 60,000 children and families throughout New York City each year with skills, opportunities, and emotional support to build healthy, successful lives.



Food Bank for New York City: Empowers every New Yorker to achieve food security and with their member network of nearly 800 soup kitchens and food pantries, they provide fresh produce, culturally relevant food, SNAP assistance, and nutrition education.



<u>WIN (Women In Need):</u> Provides safe housing and critical services to help homeless women and their children rebuild their lives and break the cycle of homelessness. Offers both transitional shelter housing and permanent supportive housing coupled with programs and services to support long-term housing stability.
